1. Acts 16:1-5,

¹ Paul went [Aor Ind] on also to Derbe and to Lystra, where there was [Aor Impv] a disciple named Timothy, the son of a Jewish woman who was a believer; but his father was a Greek. ² He was well spoken [Impf Ind] of by the believers in Lystra and Iconium.

³ Paul wanted [Aor Ind] Timothy to accompany him; and he took [Aor Inf] him and had him circumcised [Aor Ind] because of the Jews who were [Pres Ptcp] in those places, for they all knew [Plup Ind] that his father was a Greek.

⁴ As they went [Impf Ind] from town to town, they delivered [Impf Ind] to them for observance the decisions that had been reached [Pf Ptcp] by the apostles and elders who were in Jerusalem. ⁵ So the churches were strengthened [Impf Ind] in

the faith and increased [Impf Ind] in numbers daily. (Acts 16:1-5 NRSV)

² For I decided [Aor Ind]

to know [Pf Inf] nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him <u>crucified</u> [Pf Ptcp].

³ And I <u>came</u> [Aor Ind] to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling.

⁴ My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power.

⁵ so that your faith <u>might rest not</u> [Pres Subj] on

human wisdom but on the power of God.

The Discourse, 1 Cor 2:6-12

⁶ Yet among the mature we <u>do speak</u> [Pres Ind] wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are <u>doomed</u> [Pres Ptcp] to perish.

⁷ But we <u>speak</u> [Pres Ind] God's wisdom, secret and <u>hidden</u> [Pf Ptcp], which God

<u>decreed</u> [Aor Ind] before the ages for our glory. ⁸ None of the rulers of this age <u>understood</u> [Pf Ind] this; for if they <u>had</u> [Aor Ind], they <u>would not have crucified</u> [Aor Ind] the Lord of glory.

⁹ But, as it <u>is written</u> [Pf Ind], "What no eye <u>has seen</u> [Aor Ind], nor ear <u>heard</u> [Aor Ind], nor the human heart <u>conceived</u> [Aor Ind], what God

has prepared [Aor Ind] for those

who love [Pres Ptcp] him"--

¹⁰ these things God <u>has revealed</u> [Aor Ind] to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit <u>searches</u> [Pres Ind] everything, even the depths of God.

¹¹ For what human being <u>knows</u> [Pf Ind] what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one <u>comprehends</u> [Pf Ind] what is truly God's except the Spirit of God.

¹² Now we <u>have received</u> [Aor Ind] not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we <u>may understand</u> [Pf Subj] the gifts bestowed [Aor Ptcp] on us by God. (1 Cor 2:1-12
